Remember!

- ▶ To sign the Participation Form indicating you agree with the Release terms.
- ▶ To include a \$300 per person deposit.
- ▶ To postmark information by the deadline!
- ▶ To make payments via cash or cashier's check after deadline.

◆ Recognitions

The Triple Crown & Crown Jewel DanceSport Events™ are NDCA, and WDC recognized. As such, the championships and associated participants must adhere to each organization's applicable guidelines.

◆ Competing Professionals

Professional couples must present proof of their current year's registration with the National Dance Council of America (NDCA) as well as their social security number, home address, email and cell/home telephone number for tax purposes.

◆ Amateur Couples

Amateur couples must present proof of their current year's registration with the National Dance Council of America (NDCA).

◆ Foreigners

All foreigners (i.e. competitors, adjudicators, instructors, etc.) must complete United States Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Form 8233 in order to be exempt from the nonresident alien 30% withholding requirement.

◆ Deadline Rules

Dance Consultants Unlimited, Inc. reserves the right to apply any or all of the following:

- ▷ Deny the processing of accommodation reservations, dance entries, etc. until a \$300 deposit per participant has been received.
- ▷ Pay purses at half of the advertised amount or cancel events which have two or less couples entered by the deadline.
- ▷ Extend an early-bird pricing to those entries postmarked on or before the deadline.
- ▷ Assess a \$50 processing fee for each participant who has submitted paperwork after the deadline. (See inside front cover for deadline dates)

◆ Cancellations and Refunds

- ▷ All deposits and entry fees are nonrefundable so as to cover the expenses associated with processing and/or reprocessing information.
- ▷ Cancellations of any kind (i.e. tickets, room nights, packages, etc.) made 96 hours prior to arrival are nonrefundable. A cancellation of a "Paid in Full" package is nonrefundable if cancelled two weeks prior to the event.

Guidelines

30-Days

Should DCU, Inc. issue a credit, every attempt will be made to process it within 30-days following the conclusion of the event.

- ▷ Cancellations due to injury or illness, substantiated by a valid medical report, shall be taken into consideration with regard to a hardship case credit or refund. It is important to note that should a credit or refund be awarded Dance Consultants Unlimited, Inc. is entitled to retain a processing fee and/or costs already incurred.
- ▷ Acts of God, war, strikes, government regulations, disasters, civil unrest, labor disputes, transportation availability, shortage of materials or any other emergency making it inadvisable or impossible to provide the facility and/or services associated with the production of a ballroom dance event do not pose a refund situation.
- ▷ Any student, professional, studio owner or spectator making a claim, dispute, or nonpayment requiring Dance Consultants Unlimited, Inc. to hire legal council shall be held solely liable and responsible for the cost of said legal council and any and all associated fees arising thereof.

Two Age Categories

Students may enter two age categories. First, the age category in which their age actually falls. Second, the age category directly below/younger than the actual.

Pro/Am and Amateur Multi-Dance Championships are available in ALL of the age categories!

The top three pro couples winning in the Open Theatre Arts Championships at the Florida State will be the competitors in the Challenge of the Continents. A unique, personal music and costume selection is permitted and encouraged.

- ◆ Please note that we are now offering entries in the **Proficiency category**. In this category you will compete against a point system instead of other competitors. All levels can be entered as proficiency except multi-dance & scholarships. Please just check proficiency box on the entry form. **The points from proficiency categories will count as half of the value toward Top Awards including Top Teacher and Top Studio**

◆ **Pro/Am and Amateur Dance Event Guidelines**

Participants may enter separate levels per the four dance styles. Furthermore, they may enter the following in two age categories:

- j Three consecutively Closed Freestyles
Examples of three consecutively closed levels are Beg., Intermediate, and Full Gold - OR - Intermediate & Full Bronze and Beg. Silver.
The only exception to this rule is that a Bronze Student dancing for the first time at each Triple Crown Event may enter the Newcomer, Beginner, Intermediate, and Full Bronze.
- k The Advanced Freestyles (Must be the same as primary level as closed)
- l The Open Freestyles (Must be the same as primary level as closed)
- m The One-Dance Championships
- n The Multi-Dance Championships
- o The Triple Crown Scholarship Challenges

No events will be created for any participants. Students must enter events already offered by the Triple Crown.


◆ **Time Limitations**

A time of two and one half minutes shall be placed on the length of exhibitions, showcases, formations and theatre arts. Routines in excess of this limit will result in penalties and additional entry fees.

F Adjudication F

Impression Judging shall be used by adjudicators to evaluate performances. The final results shall be determined using the Skating System.

♦ **Syllabus**

• **Bronze Footwork**

Participants must use closed footwork in all Bronze smooth dances. Continuity styling will not be permitted.

• **Styling and Figures**

Penalty points will be assessed to American style performances should they contain International styling or figures.

Participants in closed International Latin and Standard events will be permitted to dance only ISTD figures per their respective category.

Open footwork will be permitted in the Advanced Freestyles as it already applies to the Open Freestyles.

• **Lifts**

Participants may include lifts in only the Theatre Arts Cabaret, Theatrical Ballroom and Showdance events.

♦ **Qualifications**

• **Scholarships**

Students qualify for Fl. State, Crown Jewel, Se. States & So. States scholarships when they attend on a minimum 'B' package. You also may enter Triple Crown Scholarship Challenges & purchase 10 dance entries in the Style in which you would like to be considered and not required to be on package.

The Southeastern, Southern States & Crown Jewel

- 250... entries qualifies for.... 1st
- 200... entries qualifies for.... 2nd

The Florida State

- 275... entries qualifies for.... 1st

• **Gift Certificates**

Certificates apply after the purchase of ten dance entries.

• **Professional Couple**

Competing professionals qualify for the special purse after the purchase of a minimum of two 'B' packages.

Qualifying Points

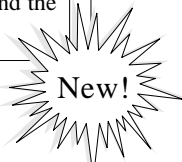
• **Top Teachers**

Teachers may qualify for purses in two ways:

- ① Purchase a min. of dance entries. (see qualifying points-left)
- ② Attend on a minimum of a 'B' package and have three or more students attend on a minimum 'B' package.

Guidelines

The will be NO deduction of points for uncontested events as this is beyond the competitor's control.



The points from proficiency categories will count as half of the value toward Top Awards including Top Teacher and Top Studio.

Lots of Points!

The Pro/Am and Amateur Multi-Dance Championships and Triple Crown Multi-Dance Scholarship Challenges offer one point per dance entered plus the points earned upon placement.

CLARIFICATION

Points that will, and will NOT count.

New-latecomer (not printed in the program) attendees' points will count toward top awards, scholarships, etc. However, pre-registered attendees' write-in points will not be counted; unless, the necessity for the write-in is due to a DCU, Inc. data processing error.)

Hardship partner replacement points will be considered on a per situation basis. Standard policy dictates whomever dances - receives points earned.

Attention!

DCU, Inc. reserves the right to cancel any event or pay scholarships, cash purses, etc. at half the advertised amount if, by the deadline date, two or less couples are scheduled to compete.

Triple Crown Guidelines

◆ Triple Crown Dance Events

- ▷ Participants are provided the opportunity to satisfy their avenue of dancing, whether it be the quality and/or quantity of dances. Quality is satisfied by entering events such as the Triple Crown Scholarship Challenges and quantity is satisfied by an automatic participation in an accumulated point system.
- ▷ Participants automatically accumulate points when they attend a Triple Crown DanceSport Event™ on a minimum 'B' package and purchase ten dance entries in the style in which they wish to compete (American or International). At the culmination of the Triple Crown year, The Florida State DanceSport Championships, participants who earn the most points per advertised categories are honored as Triple Crown Champions!
- ▷ Participants, are required to attend and dance in a minimum of two Triple Crown DanceSport Events™. However, must be present at the Triple Crown Award Ceremony to receive scholarships, etc. The upcoming Triple Crown Events are listed on the inside front cover of this publication.
- ▷ Rising Star & Open Professional couples must also attend and dance in a minimum of two Triple Crown DanceSport Events™ per series year and be present at the Triple Crown Award Ceremony to receive scholarships, etc.
- ▷ The Rising Star Triple Crown Challenges are available to students at the Bronze & Silver level. The Open Triple Crown Challenges are reserved for those students who have achieved levels of Silver and greater.
- ▷ Participants may enter the Rising Star and the Open Triple Crown Challenges per Rhythm, Smooth, Ballroom and Latin.
- ▷ Participants may use multi-dance events to satisfy the ten dance scholarship requirement at each Triple Crown DanceSport Events™
- ▷ Participants shall be awarded one point per Challenge entered. Except in the Triple Crown Multi-Dance Scholarship Challenges where one point per dance will be awarded. Upon placing: three points for first, two points for second, and one point for third will be added.
- ▷ Participants shall receive one half of the advertised scholarship amount in any Triple Crown Challenge which contains two or less competing couples by the advertised deadline.
